Spirit of Fellowship

Choir Conductor

Mr Jeffrey Black

Jeffrey Black made his operatic debut with the Australian Opera in 1984 at the age of 20 but first came to international prominence in London as a finalist in the Inaugural Walther Gruener Lieder Competition the previous year.

He made his international operatic debut at Glyndebourne in 1986 and has since performed many of the prima cavalier lyric baritone roles in the major opera houses of the world: The Metropolitan Opera Company - NY; Royal Opera House – London; Glyndebourne; The Bastille – Paris; Munich; Chicago; and the Salzburg and Aix-en-Provence Festivals. He has interpreted the roles of Mozart and Rossini to great critical acclaim – most notably The Count (Le Nozze di Figaro), The Don (Don Giovanni), Figaro (Il Barbiere di Siviglia) and Dandini (La Cenerentola).

On the concert platform he has performed with Sir Charles Mackerras, Zubin Mehta, Franz Welser Moest, Eka Pakka Saraste, Simone Young and in recital with Geoffrey Parsons, Graham Johnson, Simone Young, Piers Lane and Tahu Matheson.

During his career, Jeffrey has also performed in straight theatre, musicals and operetta, having worked with some of the world's most acclaimed directors including: the great Shakespearean director, Sir Peter Hall; the film director, Herb Ross; Germany's Dieter Dorn; UK directors



John Copley and Jonathan Miller and Australian directors, Simon Phillips, Neil Armfield and Lindy Hume. In recent years, Jeffrey has returned to the theatre performing with the Brisbane Shakespeare Festival as Antony in *'Antony and Cleopatra'* and most recently as Leonato in *'Much Ado About Nothing'*.

As well as being a performer, Jeffrey has been passionate about music education. He was a singing professor at Kingston University, London for many years and conductor of choirs in London. In 2014 Jeffrey returned to Australia to assume the role of Director of Music at Churchie – his alma mater- so bringing him full circle, back to his home town of Brisbane. Currently, he is the Chair of the Advisory Committee of The Australian Singing Competition where he has twice been the National Adjudicator. Most recently he has been appointed as Board Member of the Music and Opera Singer's Trust, MOST Australia.

Big Band Guest Conductor

Prof Rob McWilliams

Professor Rob McWilliams was born and raised in Melbourne. He holds a PhD in Music/Music Education (conducting) from the University of Minnesota, a Master in Instrumental Conducting from Florida State University and a Bachelor in Music Education from the University of Melbourne. Dr McWilliams was a United States resident from 1991 to 2014 and served as Professor of Music and Director of Bands and Instrumental Music Education at the University of Wisconsin Oshkosh from 1996 where he also served as Head of Music from 2011 to 2014. Dr McWilliams has conducted and presented at major music conferences in Japan, Hong Kong, the United Kingdom, Singapore, Europe, China, Australia, has been



published in the Journal of Band Research, Teaching Music Through Performance and is a composer/arranger with Alfred's Publishing. In early 2015 he relocated to Brisbane where he is currently working for Yamaha Music Australia as their Education Outreach Clinician, as well as teaching sessionally at the Jazz Music Institute and freelancing as a musician, educator, conductor, composer/arranger and adjudicator.

Concert Band Conductor

Mr Craig Dabelstein

Craig Dabelstein began studying the piano at age seven and took up the saxophone at age twelve. He has Bachelor of Arts (Music), Bachelor of Music degrees from the Queensland Conservatorium of Music, a Graduate Diploma of Learning and Teaching, and a Graduate Certificate in Editing and Publishing from the University of Southern Queensland. He has held the principal saxophone chairs in the Australian Wind Orchestra and has been an augmenting member of the Queensland Philharmonic Orchestra, the Queensland Symphony Orchestra, and the Queensland Pops Orchestra. He has been a casual conductor of the Young Conservatorium Symphonic Winds and a member of the Queensland Saxophone Quartet.



He was the conductor and Artistic Director of the Queensland Wind Orchestra and has been a research associate for the *Teaching Music Through Performance in Band* series of books. He is the editor of more than sixty books on music including *A Concise History of the Wind Band*, *Foundations of Music Education*, *Music Education of the Future*, *The Sousa Oral History Project*, *Wagner on Bands*, *Berlioz on Bands*, *The Art of Musical Conducting*, *Aesthetics of Music* (8 volumes) and *The History and Literature of the Wind Band and Wind Ensemble* (13 volumes). He currently teaches saxophone and clarinet, and conducts bands at St Joseph's College, Gregory Terrace.

Symphony Orchestra Conductor

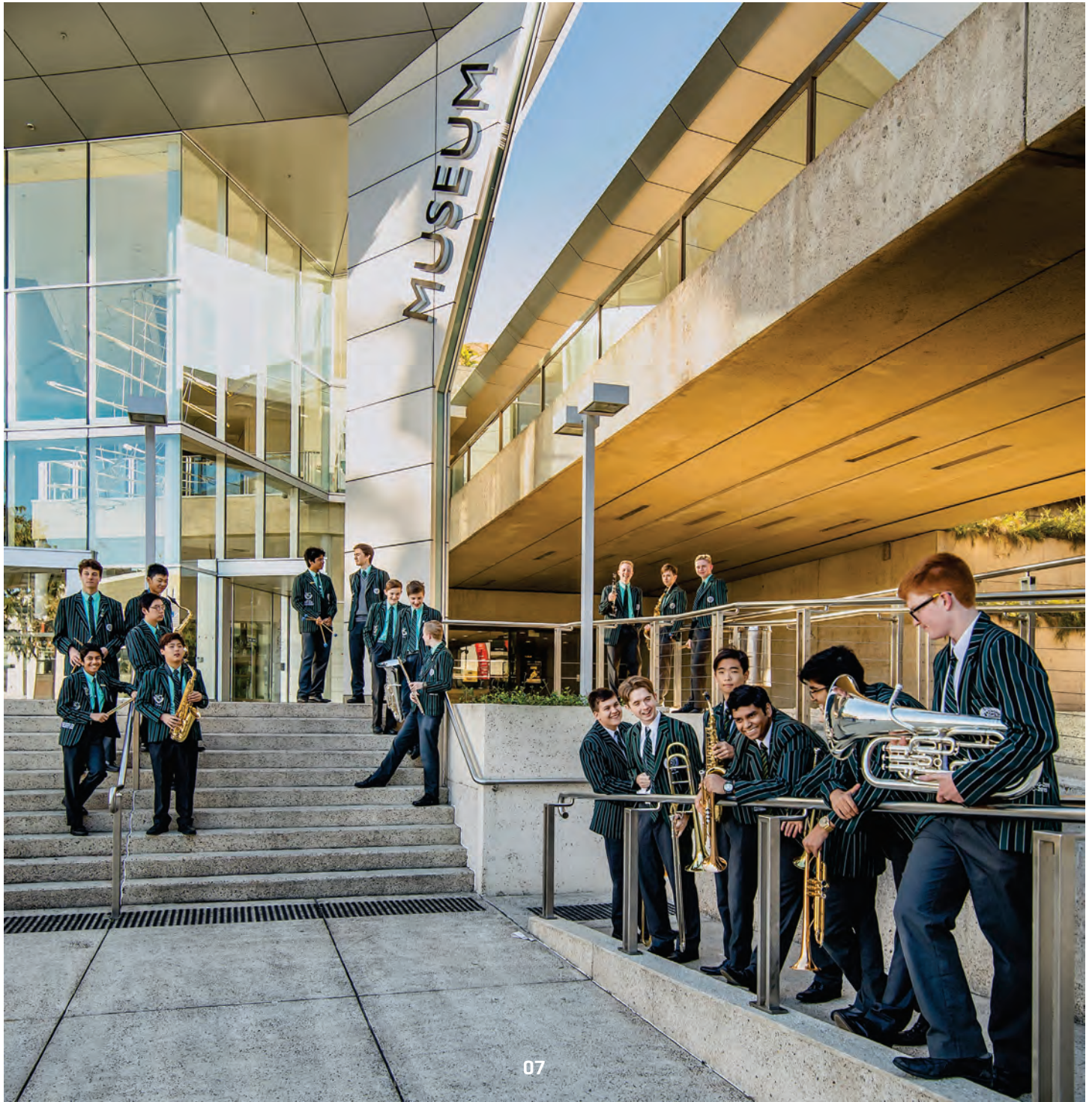
Mr Keith Sharp

Keith Sharp has been string educator in The Gap regional state schools of Brisbane since 1985. He teaches at two schools, Brisbane State High School and Ashgrove State School where his program focuses on ensemble and group tuition. Keith also enjoys writing imaginative and appealing pieces for string students, many of which are now performed by young players around the world. A selection his works is published in the USA by The FJH Music Company and Alfreds Publishing. Consistently, these educational ensemble pieces have been highlighted as "Editor's Choice" in the J.W. Pepper Orchestral Music Catalogue.



Keith holds a Bachelor of Music Degree and a Graduate Diploma of Further Education. He is a Rotary Paul Harris Fellow and in 2006 received a Ryan Recognition Award acknowledging his contribution to music education in the local community. Keith is a past President and Committee Member of Australian Strings Association (AUSTA) Queensland. In 2012 his contribution to the Queensland string community was recognised with an AUSTA State Award. In 2013 Keith was awarded the Campbell Newman 'Can Do' Educator of the Year'. Keith is co-author of the popular beginner series, *Encore On Strings - Music Maestros*.
