## RULES OF COMPETITION

## TENNIS

Last Updated: April 2022

## 1. ADOPTED RULES

GPS Boys Tennis competitions are conducted in accordance with the International Tennis Federation (ITF) Rules of Tennis, except where these differ from the GPS competition Rules; in which case the latter shall take precedence. Reference should also be made to all GPS By-laws, Policies and Procedures. These rules are to be read in conjunction with information available on GPS Net.

## 2. ELIGIBILITY

To compete in a GPS competition, students must meet the eligibility criteria stated in the GPS Eligibility Rule.
2.1 Boys enrolled in Years 5 to 12 of a GPS member school are eligible to participate in the competition.
2.2 Boys in years 7 to 12 are eligible to play in the $1^{\text {st }}$ IV or $2^{\text {nd }}$ IV divisions. Players in the $1^{\text {st }}$ IV must first be registered with the GPS Office.
2.3 Only Year 12 boys are eligible to participate in Open divisions $3^{\text {rd }} \mathrm{IV}$ and below.
2.4 Players will play in one division per fixture.
a. Exception: A substitute player in the $1^{\text {st }}$ IV may play in a second division.

## 3. BEHAVIOUR

All misconduct by participants or other personnel that occurs during the normal proceedings of a Sport or Activity will be actioned as according to the Governing body and the GPS Code of Conduct.

## 4. STRUCTURE

GPS competitions must have a minimum number of five (5) teams from five (5) member schools competing in a division.
4.1 The competition will follow the schedule as set by the GPS Calendar, the Tennis Draw and the GPS Match Day Scheduling Guidelines.
4.2 The competition is comprised of a $1^{\text {st }}$ IV division, $2^{\text {nd }}$ IV division, and multiple year level divisions from Year 5 to Open (Year 12) as required.
4.3 Each Fixture will be comprised of the following rubbers in each division:

|  | School A Player 3 v School B Player 3 | School A Team 1 v School B Team 2 |
|  | School A Player 4 v School B Player 4 | School A Team 2 v School B Team 1 |

## 5. OFFICIALS

5.1 The competition adopts the 'Procedures for Matches played without a chair umpire' issued by Tennis Australia.
5.2 The GPS Association, with the assistance of Tennis Queensland, will appoint one (1) court supervisor for each GPS $1^{\text {st }}$ IV fixture.

## 6. ADDITIONAL RULES

6.1 Uniforms of competitors and personnel must comply with the GPS Uniform Policy.
6.2 Teams will consist of a maximum of six (6) players.
a. Exception: $1^{\text {st }} \mathrm{IV}$ teams will consist of a maximum of four (4) players.
6.3 Scoring:

| Division | Singles Rubber | Doubles Rubber |

| Years 5 \& 6 | $1 \times$ set <br> (first to 6 games) |  |
| All other divisions | $1 \times$ tie-break set <br> (12 points) |  |

6.4 The following rules regarding coaching apply:

| Division | Coaching |
| :--- | :--- |
| $1^{\text {st }}$ IV \& 2 ${ }^{\text {nd }}$ IV | On-court coaching is permitted at the end of each set. |
| Year 5 \& 6 | On-court coaching is permitted at all times. |
| All other divisions | Coaching is not permitted. |

6.5 In divisions other than $1^{\text {st }} \mathrm{IV}$ and $2^{\text {nd }} \mathrm{IV}$, a deciding point will be played if deuce is reached for a second time within a game.
6.6 Fixtures will not be played under lights.
6.7 If a player retires due to injury or illness, a substitution is permitted.
a. The substitute player must have already completed their GPS playing commitment for that day
b. If a substitution occurs during a rubber, the rubber is lost by the substituting player/team.
c. If a substitution occurs during the fixture, the substitute will play in the position (or order) of the player he replaced.
6.8 Continuous Play:

| Division | Singles | Doubles |

| $1^{\text {st }}$ IV | The maximum delay between games and sets shall be one (1) minute |  |
|  | Exception: At the end of the second set a <br> five (5) minute break between sets may be <br> taken. | Exception: At the end of the second set <br> when a two (2) minute break between <br> sets may be taken. |
| $2^{\text {nd }}$ IV | The maximum delay between games and sets shall be one (1) minute <br> Exception: At the end of the second set a five (5) minute break between sets may be <br> taken. |  |
| All other divisions | As per ITF requirements |  |

6.9 Match Balls:

| Division | Type | Number Required |
| :--- | :--- | :--- |
| $1^{\text {st }}$ IV | Match balls will be the same type used at <br> the Australian Open in the year of <br> competition. | Three (3) new balls per rubber. <br> No ball changes. |
| All other divisions | As per ITF requirements | Six (6) balls per division per fixture. <br> No ball changes. |

## The following rules apply to $1^{\text {st }}$ IV fixtures only:

$6.101^{\text {st }}$ IV players will play in order of merit, where the order is determined by an Australian Tennis Ranking, a Universal Tennis Ranking or a School Championships.
a) If a player listed in the order of merit cannot play in a fixture, his replacement in the team will compete at position number four (\#4), with the order of merit maintained.
b) Each school is permitted to change their order of merit once during the season. The new order of merit must be submitted to the GPS Office no later than 12 pm Wednesday prior to the fixture.
c) Where a substitution occurs after the commencement of a fixture, Rule 6.7c applies.
6.11 A $1^{\text {st }} \mathrm{IV}$ fixture will be played in the following format:

- $4 \times$ Singles Rubbers (simultaneously)
- $2 \times$ Doubles Rubbers
- $2 \times$ Doubles Rubbers
6.12 The court supervisor may extend a medical time-out to a maximum length of ten (10) minutes at their discretion.
$6.131^{\text {st }}$ IV Fixtures will not be played on indoor courts or undercover courts.
$6.141^{\text {st }}$ IV players are entitled to twenty (20) minutes rest between rubbers, time commencing from the conclusion of the last point of the rubber.
$6.151^{\text {st }}$ IV Fixtures must be played on a hard court playing surface.


## 7. RESULTS

7.1 Points, Premierships and Championships will be awarded in accordance with the GPS Championships \& Premierships Policy.
7.2 Reviews \& Protests of results will be conducted in accordance with the GPS Reviews \& Protest Policy.
7.3 Counting for results shall be first by games, and if equal, on sets.
a. Exception: 1st IV and 2nd IV fixtures where counting for results shall be first by rubbers, then by sets, then by games.
$7.41^{\text {st }}$ IV Competition Premiership Points:

| Result | Points |
| :---: | :---: |
| Win / Win on Forfeit | 2 points |
| Draw | 1 point |
| Loss / Bye or Forfeit | 0 points |

## 8. CANCELLATIONS

When required, cancellations will be conducted in accordance with the Abandonment of GPS Competitions and Activities Policy.

## 9. AMENDMENTS

No amendment to these Rules of Competition is authorised unless such amendment is issued by the Executive Officer of the GPS.
